## What you need to know about grades

Semester grade $=\mathbf{8 0 \%}$ Course work $+20 \%$ Final Exam
Students take 5 classes per year, earning 5 credits, to graduate you need 20 credits

Standard Based Grades means that there are certain standards that must be met. Students demonstrate their understanding of these standards through common assessments.
Assessments are based on specific state, district, or school-wide standards. SBG measure the mastery of individual learning targets related to the content of the course.
SBG reflects the student's level of understanding of key concepts or standards. If a student is not proficient in a skill or key concept, students must review coursework and do additional learning until they are proficient.
